THE FUND

GO Virginia awards grants in three categories:

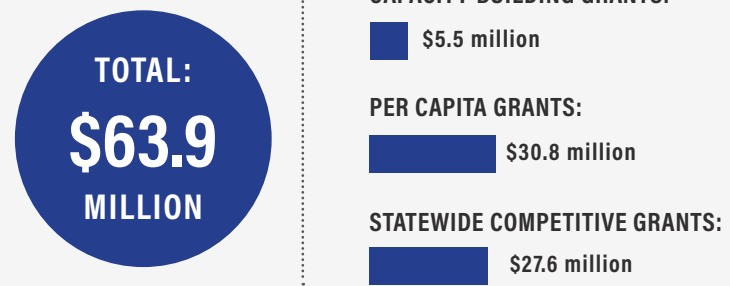
- 1 ENHANCED CAPACITY BUILDING GRANTS:** Planning grants to assist regional councils in building regional capacity for job creation and program implementation
- 2 PER CAPITA GRANTS:** Project implementation grants allocated to each region on a per capita basis for projects of regional impact
- 3 STATE COMPETITIVE GRANTS:** Awarded for projects of statewide economic impact and interregional collaborations

Potential candidates can submit an application to their Regional Council at any time and are eligible if they have support from two or more localities and if all GO Virginia funds are matched by non-state funds.

Successful grant applications will show how they fit into selected growth industries as identified in their region's Growth & Diversification Plan. They will also show a high level of collaboration with local businesses and organizations and include data to prove return on investment.

Since program inception, more than 100 public entities, including 85 localities, have contributed \$11.8 million in qualifying local match to GO Virginia projects. In addition, GO Virginia funds have helped to form or strengthen four Regional Industrial Facility Authorities (RIFAs), a best practice in regional collaboration and one which sets the stage for cost and revenue sharing around site development projects of regional significance.

BUDGET APPROPRIATED FOR THE FUND THROUGH 2020



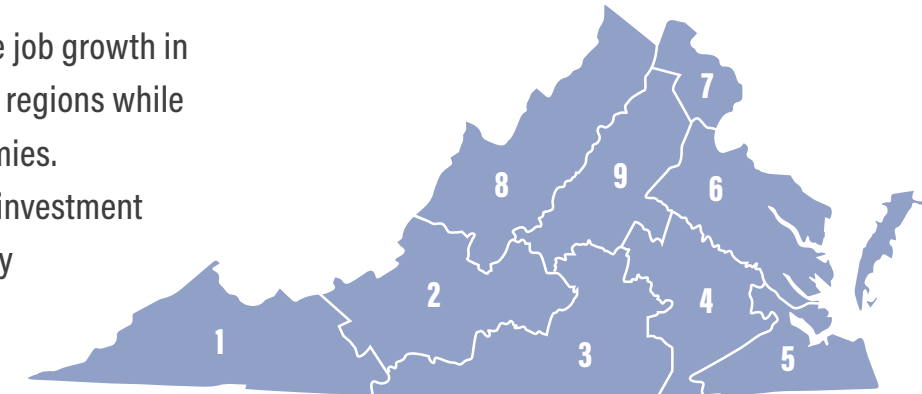
