# Strengthening Communities

## Energy Share

Helping eligible individuals with fuel costs or preventing the disconnection of electricity during financial hardship

Nearly 900 individuals served in the 2024-2025 fiscal year (895 total from 382 households).

## Virginia Homeless Solutions Program

Critical housing resources and rapid rehousing solutions

15 individuals avoided homelessness in 2024-2025.

## Domestic Violence & Sexual Assault

Immediate and long-term supportive services such as shelter and transportation, crisis intervention, advocacy, and court/medical accompaniment to regain stability.

164 cases supported in 2024-2025. Call our confidential hotline, available 24/7 at 434-572-1136.

## Home Maintenance & Private Jobs

Affordable home repair and upkeep services that empower individuals to live with dignity and independence

\$17,328.43 invested into making homes safer, stronger and more livable for local families.

## Westside Mobile Home Project

Bringing new, safe, affordable homes to the Sinai Community

26 modern, energy-efficient homes built by TCCAA, redefining what's possible for rural families seeking stability and a fresh start by 2027.

## Serving Hope Food Pantry

Monthly food support for individuals and families

281 households served monthly food boxes in 2024-2025.

## Permanent Supportive Housing Program

Permanent Supportive Housing (PSH) is a proven approach to ending chronic homelessness. It provides stable housing and supportive services to individuals and families who have experienced long-term or repeated homelessness.

The goal of PSH is housing stability, helping people move out of homelessness permanently.

## Weatherization

Home upgrades to improve energy efficiency and home safety

\$820,931.09 spent on jobs assisting 82 households within our service areas.

## Volunteer Income Tax Assistance

Free federal and state tax preparation for income-eligible individuals

Over \$100,000 saved through filing 447 tax returns during the 2024 tax season.

## USDA Family Housing Program

Buy, build or refinance homes with affordable, fixed-rate financing – even without a down payment.

## Infant & Maternal Health

Pregnancy support, parenting and self-care tools, medical care resources, educational advancement



Over 1,000 attendees at community outreach events hosted and/or supported by Infant & Maternal Health Coalition.

## Head Start

Early childhood education, health and developmental screenings, parent support

1,020 hours spent in school in 2024-2025.

540 consultations with parents for additional career resources.
